



Is "church of Christ" scriptural?

Introduction. It is good that we are concerned about what is scriptural. Indeed, we are taught to have authority for all we believe and practice (1 Pet. 4: 11, 1 Thes. 5: 21). Many will be lost in the Day of Judgment because they worked iniquity or lawlessness (Matt. 7: 21-27, no authority for their beliefs and consequent practices).

Religious names of churches. We are told that there are now thousands of different denominations in America. Each religion has a name. However, no more thought is usually given to the scriptural basis of a designation than to the religion itself. Church names often glorify their founder, philosophy, or when they claimed to have begun. Lutheran, Baptist, and Pentecostal are examples.

Scriptural designations. We read of "the church," "church of the Lord," and "church of God" (Col. 1: 18; Acts 20: 28, ASV; 1 Cor. 1: 2). You will notice that these descriptive phrases glorify God, not man, particular teaching, or time of origin. You never read of Lutheran, Baptist, or Pentecostal because these religions were started many centuries after Jesus built his church (Matt. 16: 18, 19, Acts 2: 47, KJV).

"Church of Christ?" Regarding "church of Christ," we read the following: "Salute one another with an holy kiss. The churches of Christ salute you" (Rom. 16: 16). Christ is the founder of his church, he provides the teaching, he has assigned the work, he is her husband and head, and he died for the church (Matt. 16: 19; 2 John 9-11; 1 Tim. 3: 15; Eph. 5: 22, 23; Acts 20: 28). Moreover, Christ is the savior of the church (Eph. 5: 23). Therefore, it should be no surprise that we read of "churches of Christ." It is true that it takes more than the right "name" to be the Lord's church. However, the right designation is required. Men can be united around Jesus' name and glorification, however, seeking human matters divide (1 Cor. 1: 10 ff.).

Dear Brethren,

Attached, you will find the Victor Valley Church of Christ 2025-2026 budget summary. Please take the time to review the budget and, if you like, ask questions / provide feedback to the Elders concerning this document.

Some points to consider in this budget for your information:

We have seen a lot of changes to our congregation; brethren have gone home to their reward, others have moved out of the area for different reasons, and we have many new faces worshipping with us. We have gone through a review of the budget, attempting to keep it aligned with our vision and our mission statements. We have cut where we can, but have seen a rise in cost for services that we are required to have and others we need in order to operate efficiently and effectively. We have been blessed this last year by you in the contributions you have entrusted to us for doing God's Work here in the Victor Valley area, as well as around the country and the world. We ended our fiscal year on September 30, 2025, with a very small deficit of \$2,413.00. Our income last year was almost \$302,000. Our weekly average contribution last year was about \$5,711, not including a large one-time contribution.

As we have mentioned in the past, the numbers in the budget are an educated guess based upon past expenditures, the ministry leader's input, and a forecast of anticipated needs. Because these are estimates, some of these line items may or may not be expended, while others may be above the estimate; we still need to have them in place for planning and execution purposes.

The elders have been using the Building Fund to fund large facility expenditures. The facility is aging, and we envision having to do some major work this fiscal year. Two years ago, we had a \$20,000 bill to repair the roof on the south side of the building. We need to repair the other three sides as well. This year, we replaced all three of the overhead projectors in the auditorium and have been upgrading our audio and visual systems. Our air and heating system is aging and has required extensive maintenance over the last year, and will need even more this year.

We are thankful for the talent that exists in the congregation to fix things that go wrong with the building. Without this ability, our facility maintenance costs would be much higher. We will be challenged in the future as several of our handypeople are moving away.

The elders want to thank the congregation for your prayers for wisdom in decisions we make in the work of our Lord and His church, and the support you give to this work. Please review the attached budget, and if you have any questions, please ask the elders.

May God continue to bless His Church, In Christian Love.
