"Milk and honey" were both among the earliest foods of humankind and the earliest foods mentioned in the Bible. One explanation for the famous phrase describing the Holy Land "a land flowing with milk and honey" (Exod. 3:8 and Deut. 26:15), is that it describes grazing land, one that is not permanently or intensely cultivated (Isa. 7:21-24), land that also sprouts the wildflowers from which bees produce honey. The archeologists tell us that when the Israelites first came into mountainous areas of the Holy Land, this was the kind of land they found, and there they built the first permanent dwellings. Eventually, they began to raise grain during the winter rainy season, and grapes, olives, figs, and other fruits in the dry summer months. (Deut. 11:4). The growing list of produce of the land of Israel, known as the "Seven Species" (Deut. 8:8), including wheat, barley, grapes, figs, olives, pomegranates, and dates. Later, the typical list of staples that Jesse sent with his son David to re-supply his other sons fighting the Philistines with King Saul (with an extra treat for the man in charge) included grain and milk products. "Take this ephah of roasted grain and these ten loaves of bread for your brothers," Jesse instructed David " and hurry to their camp. Take along these ten cheeses to the commander of their unit" (1 Sam. 17:17-18).

To smooth things over after her husband Nabal insulted David, Abigail also chose that well-known and very effective element of conflict-resolution: food. 1 Samuel 25:18 says, "Abigail lost no time. She took two hundred loaves of bread, two skins of wine, five dressed sheep, five seahs of roasted grain, a hundred cakes of raisins, and two hundred cakes of pressed figs, and loaded them on donkeys." We noticed that Abigail went all out with her diplomatic efforts: among the food that Abigail gave David was meat, a delicacy usually reserved for special occasions.

Ezekiel (4:9) was commanded by God to mix "beans and lentils, millet and spelt" [a kind of wheat which he was to bake and what to today's natural foods aficionados would call "multi-grain bread"], while Isaiah (28:25) adds spice to the list (literally): "does he not sow caraway and scatter cummin?" Matthew (23:23) knew cumin as a spice valuable enough to levy a tariff on it, as well as on mint and anise.
